

Releases Reported to the National Response Center 2012-2016

The National Response Center (NRC) is the sole national point of contact for reporting oil, chemical, radiological, biological, and etiological discharges into the environment. In addition to gathering and distributing spill data and serving as the communications and operations center for the National Response Team, the NRC relays notification information to various state and federal agencies. EPA has recently reviewed information from releases reported to the NRC for Region 7 (see graphics below).




Since 2012, approximately 7.0% of all release reports have led to a significant event (death, injury, community evacuation, facility evacuation, or shelter-in-place).

Deaths, injuries, and evacuations may not be directly due to exposure, but as a consequence of the accident resulting in the release.




Of the 3,865 Releases Reported to the NRC in Region 7 2012-2016

Risk Management Program Facilities in Nebraska




Releases Reported on Nebraska Risk Management Plans (RMPs)

Risk Management Program facilities must report on their RMP any accident, regardless of amount released, that resulted in:

- Death:
- Injury;
- Significant property damage on-site;
- Off-site shelter-in-place, evacuation, environmental damage, or property damage.

There were 94 accidents reported by facilities in Nebraska. In Nebraska, there were 110 total on-site injuries, 1 on-site death, 11 total evacuations involving 873 off-site individuals, over 18 million dollars of on-site property damage, and 21,000 dollars of off-site property damage. 83% of accidents resulted in Nebraska facilities making changes to prevent future releases.


